SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER DISCLOSURE

Your Social Security Number (SSN) is requested pursuant to Public Law 93-579 for the University's system of student records, as well as for compliance with federal and state reporting requirements. An SSN is required if you are applying for financial aid but is not required for admission to the University. Providing an SSN will, however, speed up the processing of your application since we will not need to manually match your application with other materials such as transcripts and test scores. Supplying an SSN ensures that you will be able to claim the Hope Tax Credit, if you are eligible, on your federal tax return. The University has a strong commitment to ensuring the privacy and confidentiality of student records and will not disclose your SSN without your consent for any purpose except as allowed by law.

AGE AND HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To enroll, you must be at least 15 years of age, have a high school diploma or GED certification, and meet requirements for competence in English. If high school graduation was by GED, you must have an official report of your GED test scores sent from the testing agency.

CRIMINAL RECORD DISCLOSURE

The University of Illinois is committed to maintaining a safe environment for all members of the University community. As part of this commitment, the University requires applicants with pending criminal charges or criminal convictions (other than a minor traffic offense or in a juvenile proceeding) to disclose this information as a mandatory step in the admissions process. A pending criminal charge or criminal conviction does not automatically bar admission to the University, but does require review. It is strongly recommended that applicants send materials by certified mail. Applicants are responsible for verifying receipt by the University and for maintaining a copy of the receipt certifying submission. Information to be submitted, in English, includes a brief explanation of the incident, location (city, county, state, country) of conviction or pending charges, dates, and court disposition. The applicant must forward the charging document, case docket, and judgment order or other disposition paperwork available. The applicant must also include a grant of permission to the University for complete access to criminal records, if any. Applicants may be required to sign additional releases. ALL APPLICANTS

There are two ways to apply:

1. Apply online at www.apply.illinois.edu. We encourage online applications because it saves time and paper. When you apply online you create an ID and PIN, which enable you to check your application status after submitting your application.

Before you begin. Take time to review the application and prepare the content you plan to provide. After writing and organizing your information, including essays and activities, it should take approximately 30 minutes to complete the application.

- **Essays.** Two essays (see questions #28 and #29 for topics) of no more than 300 words each are required in the application. The essay portion is an important factor in our evaluation, so you should allow enough time and prepare an outline of what you want to say. We want to read about you, what interests you and why. After the essays are completed, you should ask a teacher, counselor, or parent to proofread and provide feedback. Remember, they should not write for you, but help catch misspellings and give general suggestions.
- **Activities, Work Experience, Community Service, & Honors/Awards.** List the most important and meaningful experiences you've had and honors earned during high school for each question.
- **Pick a major.** You can browse our list of majors and concentrations online at www.admissions.illinois.edu. Research the particular program you're interested in and try to describe your interest or experience in that subject when writing the application essays.
 - » If you're undecided about a major, you can apply as undeclared to the Division of General Studies.
 - » On the application, you may only apply to one program; however, you will automatically be considered for other related majors, including undeclared in the Division of General Studies, if you are not selected for admission to your first choice.
 - » If you are interested in pursuing a career in law, medicine, nursing, or secondary education, indicate this goal on question #15.
- **Honors Programs.** Your Undergraduate Application for Admission is the same application used for admission into most campus honors programs. Admission into honors programs is determined by a combination of GPA, test scores, rigor of coursework, and strength of essays. If you're interested in being accepted to an honors program, the best way to approach the application is with care and attention to detail. Be thorough when writing the application essays and elaborate on your special achievements, interests, extracurricular activities, and work experience. Priority for honors programs may be given to applicants who apply during the Priority Filing Period. If you're selected to an honors program, you'll receive notification directly from the program by April 1. For more information, visit www.admissions.illinois.edu/academics.
- **Merit-Based Scholarships.** Your Undergraduate Application for Admission is the same application used for all merit-based scholarships. You will automatically be considered for scholarships when you apply. Priority for scholarships may be given to applicants who apply during the Priority Filing Period. Our scholarships are granted to students based on academic achievement and are awarded by individual colleges and departments. If you're awarded a scholarship, you'll receive notification directly from the department by April. For more information about scholarships at Illinois, visit www.admissions.illinois.edu/cost.
- **Need-Based Aid.** To be considered for need-based aid, you must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Our priority date to apply for need-based aid is March 15. We don't want you to overlook a vital portion of a question.

- **Give accurate information.** Try to give a true picture of who you are, where your interests lie, and what your academic goals include. We will learn a lot about you if you take the time to tell us your aspirations, successes, and challenges you're facing.
- **Proofread.** Admission is competitive and mistakes and omissions can hurt your chances.
- **Double-check your e-mail address.** We send important information via e-mail. Please submit an address that will be checked frequently and notify the Office of Undergraduate Admissions if you change it.
- **Application Fee.** Please submit a nonrefundable \$40 application fee (\$50 for international applicants), payable to the University of Illinois, or a completed fee waiver from your high school guidance counselor.
- **Submit your completed application.** This can be done either online or via paper application and needs to be signed and dated and all supporting documents must be included.
- **Talk to your guidance counselor about submitting transcripts.** We need an official high school transcript covering all the subjects you've studied. If you attended other high schools, official transcripts from those schools are also required. Transcripts must be sent directly from the schools. If you apply during the Priority Filing Period, transcripts must be postmarked by November 2. If you apply between November 2 and January 2, they must be received by January 12.
- **Submit your test scores.** It's required that you send us a standardized test score: ACT (code 1154) or SAT 1 (code 1836) scores are accepted. The writing component of the ACT is required. If you apply during the Priority Filing Period, test scores must be postmarked by November 2. If you apply between November 2 and January 2, they must be received by January 12.
- **Check the status of your application.** Once you receive acknowledgement of receipt from us, you may check the status of your application through our Web site: www.admissions.illinois.edu. IMPORTANT DATES & DEADLINES

PRIORITY FILING PERIOD

September 1 - November 1, 2009

Your application and all supporting documents (transcripts, test scores, and application fee or fee waiver) must be received online by midnight CST on November 1, 2009, or postmarked by November 2, if you wish to apply during the Priority Filing Period. Completing the application during the Priority Filing Period may give you the best chance for being admitted to academic programs with limited space. You also may receive special attention for admission to honors programs and for merit awards.

APPLICATION FILING PERIOD

September 1, 2009 – January 2, 2010

Applications must be postmarked by or received online by midnight CST on January 2. We need to receive all supporting documents (transcripts and test scores) by January 12. We encourage you to complete the application early in the filing period. By completing the application early, you have time to request and ensure the arrival of your transcripts to the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

ADMISSION NOTIFICATION

There are two admission notification dates:

December 11, 2009, and February 19, 2010

If you apply during the Priority Filing Period, you will be notified of your admission status on December 11. In some cases an applicant will be deferred, and a final admission decision will not be made until the second notification date of February 19. If you apply between November 2 and January 2, or are deferred on December 11, you will be notified of a decision on February 19.

STUDENTS APPLYING TO ART FOUNDATION, THEATRE FOUNDATION, AND DANCE:

The final notification date will be March 15, 2010.

STUDENTS APPLYING TO MUSIC: Priority filing does not apply to music applicants. You will be notified by March 15, 2010.

APPLICATION TIPS

You're probably wondering what we consider while reviewing an application. We place special emphasis upon your high school transcripts, including rigor of coursework, grades, class rank (if available), and senior year courses. We also look at test scores and application essays, in addition to non-academic aspects of your life, such as extracurricular activities, work and volunteer experience, and honors and awards received. We review the complete picture of who you are and how you will contribute to the talented, bright, and diverse student body at Illinois.

Following is a checklist to help guide you through the application process. You'll also find some helpful tips on how to fill out the form, as well as directions for parts of the application that may not be self-explanatory. Go ahead and check off the steps as you complete them; we don't want you to overlook an important aspect of the application.
